MEDITATIONS

Dear Congregation,

"And it shall be..." (1 Kings 17:4a).

The Lord is a promising God, and He is ever faithful unto what He has promised. It is different with us. We often promise something, and then we forget what we have promised. That is not so with the Lord as may be seen in the life of Elijah. This servant of the Lord is leaving because the Lord has spoken to him about a hiding place. In complete obedience he travels upon a way unknown to him, but he does not go without hope because the Lord is with him. Elijah may go with the promise, "And it shall be," meaning, when you arrive, I will take care of you.

Oh, what a blessed people who may hear that in all their future days the Lord will be there for them. How often when they face serious trials do they look up and ask, "Lord, Thou art there; wilt Thou undertake for me?" Elijah may hear, "And it shall be, that thou shalt drink of the brook..." Here the Lord is saying, "Even though all other water sources are drying up, you may drink of the brook I have provided for you."

Maybe you know what it is when everything is drying up; there is not one drop of water for your thirsting soul. Will such a child of God perish? No, for him there is a faithful covenant-keeping God. "And it shall be that I will sustain you from the fountain of living waters opened in a suffering and dying Mediator."

"And I have commanded the ravens (birds of prey) to feed thee there." Oh, Elijah, you may believe that your God will care for you. Elijah bows and by faith drinks water from the brook his God has provided. Then he looks up into the sky believing that His God will feed him. How privileged you are when you may look to Elijah's God.
