MEDITATIONS

If we would celebrate the Lord's Supper to our comfort, then it must be directed to that end for which Christ hath instituted it, namely, to His remembrance. If we celebrate the remembrance of someone, we must know him. How necessary, therefore, is the knowledge of Him and the hungering and thirsting after Him...

What must we say about those who do not dare to take Christ for their possession, and still they hunger and thirst after Him? Their case is not doubtful, because God's Word pronounces them blessed (Matthew 5). May such as these partake of the Lord's Supper?

Teelinck writes in his *The Practice of the Lord's Supper*, "Hence, although you perhaps cannot firmly believe without any doubt the forgiveness of your sins and the healing of your diseases; if you are but desirous for this, if you are unfeignedly hungry and thirsty for it, you will be a welcome guest at the table of the Lord, for you have to do with a gracious God, Who will not break the bruised reed or quench he smoking flax. Indeed it is He who has promised that He will satisfy those who unfeignedly hunger and thirst after spiritual gifts." ~Rev. A Hoogerland from *Partaking of the Lord's Supper, but How?*
