MEDITATIONS

"And he said, Who art Thou, Lord?" (Acts 9:5a).

On the way to Damascus, lay a man as an enemy of God upon the way to a never-ending eternity; the Lord had arrested him, stopped him and changed him. What he thought he knew before, he no longer knew. He thought he knew who the Lord was, and he believed the way to eternal life was by keeping the Law. Now that the Lord had arrested him, he had become blind, pertaining to all those former ways, and he stammered, "Who art Thou, Lord?"

What a wonder it is that the Lord has an answer for such a question, and the answer will reveal that the Lord is the same One whom Saul has fought against, "breathing out threatenings and slaughter." When we think of Saul lying there, a sinner arrested by the Lord, it is perhaps the time to ask you, "Were you ever arrested by the Lord in this way?" It is possible to know as much as Saul did and not know who the Lord is in His arresting love. Will it be well for our soul, there must come a time, God's time, in our life that we as sinners are arrested.

Although we do not have the same calling as Saul had in his life, may we believe that our burdened, troubled heart is caused by God's alluring love? May we know amidst the heavy assaults we experience that we cannot miss the Lord anymore? Perhaps you say, "That is the question that lies awakened in my heart day and night; is it God's work, or is it but a morning cloud that will pass away and cause me to sink deeper into the abyss that I fear?" Let me ask you, then, "Is there sorrow in your heart? Do you lift up empty hands begging for mercy? Remember, ultimately, it is not what I know, but what the Lord knows of me."
