But they could not go to church where they at least needed no special exertion of strength. They were capable for their work the following day, but I caused them to believe that they were too weak to go to church. I made them realize that if they could not work the next day it would be a loss to them. I made use of the mammon and the result was, they remained home and by degrees more and more."

"Well done," said the hellish prince with a devilish grin upon his face. "Sunday headaches would go away with coming into the fresh air and hearing something good in church, and backaches would be forgotten when the mind and heart were kept busy with higher, with heavenly things.
